An Option for Giving

We now have a link on our website http://www.midwaybc.net/giving/) to the portal that can be used to sign up for Egiving. You can create an account for one time or regular weekly/monthly giving that is drawn from your bank by EFT or from a debit card. This is very convenient for those who may not remember to carry or prepare a check for regular tithing. You can also make designated gifts to the building fund, food pantry or any of the other designated areas of ministry our church supports. Egiving is also available as an app for your apple or android smartphone, giving you the option of signing in with your phone.

We have had some questions regarding the security of online giving and we followed up with our company representative. This is from Lindi Carr of NCS Services:

We at NCS partner with ATW Trustwave, the largest data security and compliance provider in the industry. We follow a number of strict guidelines set by the Payment Card Industry (PCI) to ensure the security of our digital network and the safety of our data, internally and externally (from potential hackers).

In the event there is a security breach, we have a \$1 Million insurance policy, which covers our organization and your church.

It is important to consider that the least secure method of payment for your organization, and the one most subject to fraud, is a traditional hardcopy check. We are able to implement controls over your electronic payments that simply are not possible with paper checks.









Fellowship Meal 10th year Celebration

On May 13, 2015, a special celebration was held to mark the 10 year anniversary of weekly fellowship meals served in our Ministry Center.
