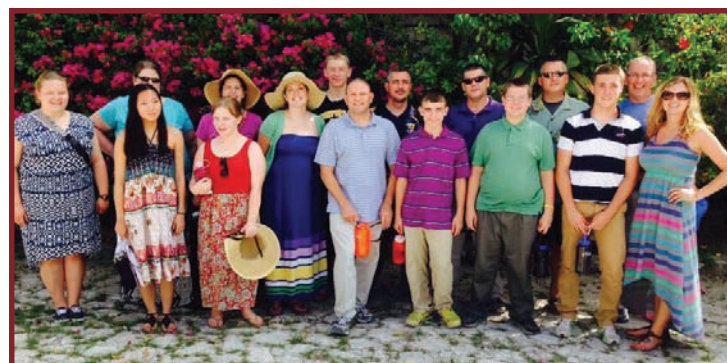
church building with love, joy and learning!! Please join me in a thought of celebration: PRAISE THE LORD!!

Also, on June 18th, we began a spiritual conversation about God's will and purpose for our future together. CBF calls this endeavor "Dawnings." This is an organic/local endeavor/ask God in prayer: "What do you want us to be?", "What do you want us to do?"

This process of discernment will help us with ministry initiatives in the future. (Maybe a mission team in Zambia next summer??) Are there new calls in Midway that we can answer for God's glory? (Habitat for Humanity started a new build here in Midway. The process will take several months if you would like to be involved!)

It sure is an exciting time to be the pastor of MBC!!

The Haiti Mission Team has returned home. We spent nine days working on houses and building relationships. The things we saw there have deeply impacted each one of us.

We worked in Lambi Village on Saturday, where we conducted the first VBS for the children. We played games and sang songs. We distributed the care packages made by our children. Finally, we fed 150 hungry kids. Unfortunately, there were 162 hungry kids. While we were thinking about this, our lunch was delivered. We gave our food to the remaining kids, but it was a painful introduction to life in Haiti.

We worked on three houses. We built trusses, painted, tied rebar, carried block and worked on fixing the well. The work was difficult, hot and dusty. We enjoyed working together with the villagers toward a common goal. We were joined by a Baptist Church from Richmond, VA. We really enjoyed working with Micah and Bryan and the others on their team. Our youth really worked hard, without complaint. They did every job, no matter how hot or difficult it was and we are extremely proud of them.

The warmth and love of the Haitian people is hard to describe. They are so hopeful it is inspiring. Haiti is a difficult place, with more problems than we can imagine. In contrast, the people of Lambi Village are joyful and hopeful. They have faith in the face of terrible adversity. The children exemplify the hope in the village. Wherever we went, we were met by smiling children. They held our hands, sat in our laps and stole our hearts.

We would like to thank all of our family and friends who supported us on this mission. Your prayers, volunteer work and financial support made this mission possible. Every aspect of MBC contributed to the success of this mission. Thanks to the WMU, everyone who donated or worked the yard sale, everyone who organized and attended the concert, everyone who participated in the master chef event, everyone who helped make care packages, all the spouses and loved ones at home, and anyone who helped in any way.

Finally, thank you for your prayers. We all returned home safely. There were several times we felt The Lord protecting us. With a few minor exceptions, we all remained healthy and able to work. None of us came down with chikungunya fever, which is rampant in Haiti. For this we are truly thankful.
